Self-deception has a negative impact on addiction in that there is an inverse relationship between self-deception and the duration of abstinence (individuals with higher self-deception scores are more likely to experience shorter periods of abstinence) Consequently, the level of arbitrary beliefs related to addiction are also higher

- Strong tendency for self-deception and false beliefs
- Overarching optimism bias
- Irrational risk-taking behavior
