It has been reported that about 73% of individuals over the age of 65 have multiple chronic diseases, and have an average of 27 chronic diseases [6] More than half of elderly workers have multiple chronic diseases [6], and may experience difficulties in health-related self-management due to the impact of those diseases on their physical
