All harm reduction strategies or measures should be in line with the provisions of international drug control treaties General harm reduction strategies • Education strategies The first step in harm reduction is to provide accurate information about the consequences and risks of drug use and promote behaviours that reduce risk

- The Harm Reduction Coalition Overdose Prevention Tips Use less after any period of abstinence! o After even a short time without using drugs, your tolerance goes down - this significantly increases the risk of overdose Do not mix drugs, prescriptions, and/or alcohol Use a less risky method (ie snort instead of smoke or inject)

Developing harm reduction in the context of youth ...

harm reduction are limited in both research and program development Methods: This paper draws on data from the Researching Adolescent Distress and Resilience (RADAR) study, which utilized an ethnographic approach to bring youth voice to the literature on mental health and substance use

Harm reduction is frequently associated with substance use; however, additional examples of harm reduction include wearing a seatbelt while driving or riding in a moving vehicle, condom use during sexual activity, wearing sunscreen, and taking pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP)
