Importance of High Expectations - Oregon GEAR UP

Essential to a culture of high expectations is providing students with high levels of support To merely increase expectations without helping students achieve success almost always leads to frustration and failure (Williamson & Blackburn, 2010) Support includes scaffolding within lessons by using graphic organizers
