RUNNING RECORD OBSERVATION

A running record is a detailed, objective, sequential recording written while the event is happening It is generally short, often only 10 minutes or less The observer writes down everything possible that the child says and does during a specified length of time or during a designated activity Record all observed behavior, in great detail

Observation and Assessment

Running Record A running record is a written description of the child's behaviour The observer records exactly what a child says and does in sequence as he/she watches This method of observation enables educators to record more detail, to describe more accurately, to avoid assumptions, be aware of personal biases, and also to make

Documenting Children Types/Samples Method 1: Anecdotal ...

running commentary at a football match That is the commentator describes in detail what is exactly happening In a similar way a running record records exactly what a child is doing and saying within a particular time-frame Running records are used mainly to provide very objective information about a particular situation

Time & Event Sampling

A record lasting for a predetermined length of time (eg 30 seconds or 1 minute) is made at regular intervals (eg every 10 minutes or every hour) about what a particular child (or group of children) is doing It is a useful technique for:! Observing a child's total behaviour and to find out what a child does typically

Anecdotal Records (Observations)

The record of this event can be detailed or brief These short reports describe, in a factual way, the incident, its context, and what was said or done by the participant(s) In most cases, anecdotes focus on very simple, everyday interactions among children, children and adults as well as children and materials

words conveying exactly what a child said and did Record what the child did when playing or solving a problem Use specific language to describing what the child said and did including facial expression and tone of voice; avoid interpretations of the child's behavior; For example "He put on a firefighter's hat
