### **Three Approaches of Institutionalism**

Sociological Institutionalism •Organizations often adopt a new practice because it enhances the social legitimacy of the organization and its participants ("logic of social appropriateness" vs "logic of instrumentality") •Examples: immigration policy, battle of sex and gender, SCO 8
