1 Summarize: condense the main idea of the source into your own words 2 Paraphrase: capture the precise meaning of a small section of a source in your own words 3 Quote: copy the exact words of a source Know when and how to paraphrase, summarize, and quote See the "Paraphrasing, Summarizing, and Quoting" handout available at the Writing

1 Direct quote: copy an idea word for word from a source Must use "quotation marks" 2 Paraphrase: summarize an idea from a source in your own words You still must give the author CREDIT for his or her IDEA An in-text citation must include 3 parts 1 The name of the author and source if both are available 2 The page number 3

Summarize Your Source Summarizing information helps condense it for use in your own paper A summary helps you understand the key ideas and content in an article, part of a book, or a cluster of paragraphs It presents key ideas and information from a source concisely in your own writing ...

Writing Summaries and Paraphrases To write a summary or paraphrase, first read and reread your source until you understand exactly what it is saying Write down the relevant information from the source At this point you may still be using phrasing and language from the source So next, without looking at the source...
