*Dyḗus (lit. "daylight-sky-god"), also *Dyḗus ph₂tér (lit. "father daylight-sky-god"), is the reconstructed name of the daylight-sky god in Proto-Indo-European mythology. *Dyḗus was the bright sky of the day conceived as a divine entity and as the seat of the gods, the *deywós. Associated with the vast diurnal sky and with the fertile rains, *Dyḗus was often paired with
