More girls are playing sports than ever before—which, on the surface, is great for girls because sports offer positive and empowering fun for

young women. In reality, though, few young athletes report “fun” as a reason they play sports. The rates of concussions and repetitive use injuries are on the rise, and kids are encouraged to specialize in a single sport at earlier and earlier ages, spending much of their free time throughout the year dedicated to the pursuit of a single sport at the expense of friends, other activities, and sometimes, health. Alarmed by the stories he heard from young athletes in his classes, sports scholar Rick Eckstein set out to investigate youth sports—why young people are playing them, how they have changed over time, and their impact on kids and families. The Qur'an, believed by Muslims to be the word of God, was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad 1400 years ago.
